All the above expenditures were for normal operating expenses. All obligations have been paid including 1/10 of conference and district apportionments, making 50% of our obligation paid for the year. \$5,170 of the total received was for the Capital Campaign, making total received for Capital Campaign to date \$23,310. There were no expenses for the Capital Campaign in May.

Statements for the first half of the year will be out by mid-July. You may pick them up in the box outside the sanctuary on Sunday morning or from the office at other times. Please review yours and let Sandra know of any corrections. Be sure that all contributions have been entered into the correct account. If your contribution should be split into two or more ways, please indicate the split on the memo line on the check. This will assist our financial secretary in getting our reporting correct. Thank you.



2018 Project AGAPE Christmas Boxes for the Children of Armenia (Packing List)

1. Please use only plastic shoe size (6 qt.) boxes with lids. An example of this is made by Sterilite Plastic Box. Please do not use a cardboard shoe box, it cannot be accepted. The plastic boxes with lids will be useful in other ways to the children and their families.
2. Feel free to include in your box a note of greeting and encouragement. You may want to include a picture of yourself or a group in your church. Also, if you want to correspond with the child who receives your box, please include your postal address.
3. Please enclose \$5 in cash or check for transportation costs for each box. Checks are to be made out to:
 - a. **FOR WNCN CONFERENCE:** "WNCN Treasurer" and mark "AGAPE-Xmas Boxes," on the memo line. Checks may be mailed WNCN Treasury Services, Project AGAPE, PO Box 18005, Charlotte, NC 28218 OR given to your local church treasurer who may then send a single check using the address and instructions listed above. Boxes should be delivered to the Mission Response Center or included in the district's AGAPE collections.
 - b. **FOR NCC CONFERENCE:** "NC Conference" & marked for Agape Christmas Boxes. Checks may be placed inside of the box ON TOP of the gift items or mailed to NC Conference, PO Box 890202, Charlotte, NC 28289-0202. All boxes should be taken to the MERCI Mission Warehouse at 676 Community Drive in Goldsboro. Many Districts will have drop-off points in those Districts. Special deliveries can be arranged by contacting Bill Haddock at revbill@ncconline.org or at 910-262-3831. All boxes and items for the boxes are needed at the MERCI Warehouse no later than October 1, 2018.
4. Please choose the age level and sex of the child for whom you want to prepare a box. Fill the box as specified below. LIST EVERYTHING YOU PUT IN YOUR BOX AND THE AMOUNT USING THE CHECK LIST AND TAPE IT SECURELY TO THE OUTSIDE OF THE BOX. If you add anything that is not listed, please write it in under "other." Wrap box with 3 rubber bands to secure the lid.

Please write in the number of items included on the blank lines instead of a check mark if the quantity is other than the mentioned one.

A Message from Crisis Control Ministry

My friends,

As you are aware, we are totally reliant on volunteers to meet the needs of our neighbors. CCM's volunteer numbers have been steadily decreasing for different reasons including employment, family obligations, medical issues, lack of time, etc. Client Interviewers are especially needed. An interviewer works directly with the client and then confers with a lead volunteer to determine whether CCM can help or not. Because we are charged to be good stewards of the donations received, the information concerning each case needs to be verified (banks, landlords, utility companies, etc.) so our hours of service are Monday – Friday with two shifts a day 9:00 a.m. – 12:00 noon and 1:00 p.m. – 4:00 p.m. We understand that most people work during those hours, but I know there are retired individuals, stay-at-home parents, individuals who work night shifts or work from their homes, or those who have flexibility in their work schedules. Independence Day Lessons for Church Life

- Return to the Basics – On July 4 we commemorate the origins of our country. In terms of faith, we also periodically need to hear once again the foundational stories of Creation, the Israelites and, of course, Jesus.
- Honor the Gift of Freedom – “For freedom Christ has set us free ... do not submit again to a yoke of slavery” (Galatians 5:1, ESV). We strive as citizens to preserve and live out our national freedom. Likewise, as citizens of God’s kingdom, we live gladly in the freedom of salvation and share that gift with others.
- Enjoy Community – July 4th is known for picnics, parades and other community gatherings. Similarly, the church is nourished by coming together for worship, meals and other special events.
- Be a Light In the Darkness – As fireworks brighten the sky with light and color, the church is called to display the Gospel’s unique light in a dark world. Our word dynamite and the Greek word for power – as in, “You will receive power when the Holy Spirit comes on you” (Acts 1:8) – share a root word. (The Greek *dunamis* is used 120 times in the New Testament and refers to “strength, power, or ability.” It is the root word of our English words dynamite, dynamo and dynamic.) Through God’s power in us, we share Jesus – dynamically! – with others.
