This food drive will benefit Crisis Control Ministry.** Volunteers and trucks will be

located at each gate to receive the food donations and give out the fair entrance tickets. Have a fun day at the fair and help feed the hungry in our community.

H.O.P.E.

H.O.P.E. (Helping Our People Eat) is alive and well at Burkhead. A group of Church members continue to **meet the first and last Sundays of each month at 8:30 am** in the kitchen to make 100 sandwiches. The sandwiches are individually bagged with a piece of fruit or yogurt, and a healthy dessert. We then pack them in 2 coolers and deliver them to H.O.P.E.'s building where they will be delivered with 900 other sandwich bags to 1000 children. The bags begin to be delivered at Noon by caravans. These sandwich bags give the children a decent meal so they aren't too terribly hungry when they head off to school Monday morning. Consider joining us on these Sundays. The fellowship is fabulous and you feel good about what you just did.

Samaritan Ministries Penny Campaign

With a poverty rate of 24%, a lot of people in Winston-Salem need
