

Total Spent	\$18,021	\$147,996


All expenditures were for normal operating expenses. All obligations were paid including 1/10 of conference and district apportionments, making 7/10 of our obligation paid for the year. \$31,720 of the total received was for the Capital Campaign, making total received for Capital Campaign to date \$48,520.

To All Committee Chairs and others who are given the responsibility for making purchases for the use of the church - Please read and keep this information:

There are several ways you can purchase items for use by the church:

- 1. The church has three credit cards – 2 are kept in the church office and can be checked out from Darlene or Sandra, and one is kept for the use of the Trustees. **You can purchase using any of these cards, then turn in the receipt along with the form entitled “Church Credit Card Charge Form” to Sandra.***
- 2. You can purchase using your own credit or debit card – again you turn in the receipt, but this time you use the form entitled “Personal Reimbursement Form for Church Expenses”.*
- 3. You can pay with cash – and again you turn in the receipt and use the form entitled “Personal Reimbursement Form for Church Expenses”.*

The church can now be refunded any sales tax paid by any of the above methods. This is a change from previous years.


