






### FATHER'S DAY HISTORY

The first known Father's Day service occurred at Williams Memorial Methodist Episcopal Church South in Fairmont, West Virginia, July 5, 1908, thanks to the efforts of Grace Golden Clayton. Mrs. Clayton had asked her pastor, Dr. R. Thomas Webb, if a Sunday service could be held to honor fathers. Missing her own dad, Mrs. Clayton wanted to have a service in remembrance of the over 200 fathers who died in the Monongah mining explosion that occurred near Fairmont on December 6th of the previous year. Although the Fairmont service was the first known event to honor fathers, it did not become an annual event nor was the idea promoted. Mrs. Sonora Smart Dodd is credited for being the one to popularize it. As she sat listening to a Mother's Day sermon in 1909, Mrs. Dodd thought that it might be nice to honor fathers as well. The first Father's Day in Washington was observed on June 19, 1910 and became an annual event there. In spite of enormous support, Father's Day did not become a permanent national holiday for many years. The first bill was introduced in Congress in 1913, but even with encouragement by President Woodrow Wilson, it did not pass. In 1966, Lyndon Johnson issued a proclamation designating the third Sunday in June to honor fathers. Finally, in 1972, President Richard Nixon signed a law declaring that Father's Day be celebrated annually on the third Sunday in June. It has been an official, permanent national holiday ever since.

My beautiful friend Lula Fulcher, aka, Ms. Lula, died Thursday, May 23rd, at 96 years of age. I met her six years ago when Daryl and I started camping at Sycamore Lodge Campground near Aberdeen, North Carolina. Roseland United Methodist Church was close to the campground so we decided to visit the first Sunday after we arrived at the campground. When we walked in the doors, a member Linda Fogleman, asked me if I knitted or crocheted, I said both. She invited me to be a part of their Prayer Shawl Ministry. I went and now I go every time we camp. Ms. Lula wanted to be a member and was homebound. She offered her home as the meeting place and the ladies took her up on her offer. We met at her home until she fell and broke her hip 2.5 years ago. Then we moved to her skilled nursing room until a week ago when she had a stroke. She crocheted a lap shawl weekly. I do know where she is now with our Lord and Savior.

So why did I tell you this? To start a Prayer Shawl Ministry at Burkhead has been my mind for several years. Now is the time for me to find out if there is any interest within our Church members or those who say sign me up now. A Prayer Shawl Ministry is a group of individuals coming together knitting or crocheting shawls or lap throws to give to individuals going through traumatic situations, health issues, the loss of a loved one, etc. The person to receive the shawl is prayed over as the piece is being made.
