PASTOR'S PAGE

I am a lectionary preacher. What does that mean?

I use the Revised Common Lectionary to guide my scripture readings in order to choose what Bible verse or verses I use as a basis for my sermons each week. But what does that mean?

The Revised Common Lectionary, or RCL, is a three-year rotation of four separate readings for each week of the year. There is ordinarily an Old Testament Reading, a Psalm reading, an Epistle reading (or a reading from the Book of Acts), and a reading from one of the four Gospels. Over the many centuries of Christendom, there have been many lectionaries (a book or list that contains a collection of scripture readings appointed for Christian or Judaic worship on a given day or occasion), but the RCL was formulated over several decades and released in 1994 by the North American Consultation on Common Texts (CCT) and the International English Language Liturgical Consultation for use by many Protestant denominations, including United Methodists. One purpose of the RCL is to increase Biblical literacy, encouraging the reading of more scripture passages both during the worship service and by preachers and congregations outside of worship. This means that, rather than my preaching each Sunday on the Gospel of John and/or the Epistle of James (two of my favorites), I will have an opportunity to prayerfully consider multiple passages and ideas for examination and explication.



How do the four weekly passages fit together? Sometimes, there's no apparent unity between the various verses. Other times the connection is at best obscure. Sometimes the theme is so obvious we might smile in appreciation for the point to be so clear. For example, Exodus 12:1-14, Psalm 149, Romans 13:8-14, and Matthew 18:15-20 are the readings for September 6, 2020, which is the Fourteenth Sunday after Pentecost in Year A. A preliminary look at the readings show the Hebrew people being taught to celebrate Passover, the Psalmist encouraging joyous praises to God, Paul encouraging the church in Rome to live honorably, and Matthew recounting Jesus' admonition to the believers to handle conflict in a way that can lead to reconciliation. While there are some readers who may feel that there are no apparent similarities in these passages, I'm noticing a theme of encouragement: God desires the people to celebrate the past and aim towards creating a future in which all God's children may be reconciled to God and to one another. As I prepare to preach on September 6, I will seek to convey this theme within the worship service.

There are many other ways to prepare to preach, but I find that I benefit from the framework of the RCL and rarely stray from it. I also would benefit from having members of the congregation reading the lectionary passages along with me, and I hope to begin a Bible study based on the readings as soon as we are able to meet together. We believe that the Holy Spirit makes the Word of God real to each of us, and I believe that the communion of believers reading and praying together can serve to increase the depth of our scriptural understanding. Thanks be to God for this gift!
