



Now more than ever, we invite you to reflect upon the significance of the Christ-child for our lives and world today!


### **Annual Christmas Party Planned**



Friends and Partners,

On December 10th, SPARK is hosting our second Cozy Bundle Event. Last year, our event served 300+ children. There are far too many children in Forsyth County who are without a comfortable bed to sleep in, a coat to protect them from the cold, and a comfortable set of pajamas for healthy sleep in order to set them up for success the next

day. Our partner, A Bed and A Book, states that 2-3% children in America currently sleep on the floor. We want to help our local children stay cozy and sign up to receive a bed at our event. The Community Coat Closet will be present to provide warm wear to all who enter our doors.

Please consider sponsoring a dresser and/or a rack for our event as we stuff and hang with blankets and pajamas size Newborn to Adult Small, Medium, Large, XL and 2XL. Rusted Pearl Artisans and SPARK lead service projects for groups to repurpose donated dressers and other furniture so that families can make their house a home. There is dignity in putting things in a drawer and sitting at a table to eat that feels new and just for you. At this event, we hope to meet families who need a dresser while they're receiving a bundle of cozy things. Last year, we were so excited to give all of our dressers to families who attended the event. Parents and caregivers will select the pajamas that fit their child's size and style, along with a blanket that will warm their bodies and heart. We will organize and schedule dresser deliveries right off of the event floor.

Your sponsorship will not only cover the cost of most needed pajama sizes and blankets, but will also cover the cost of durable bags to help families transport their pajamas, blankets, and books for each of their children to take back to their home. Many families will take the bus or walk. We're thankful A Bed and A Book will be present to take children's information to receive a bed. This year we will also have a meal available.

**Small Dresser Level** stuffed with 30 blankets for 30 children, \$200 **Large Dresser Level** stuffed with 40 blankets for 40 children, \$275 **Rack Level** holding 50 sets of pajamas for 50 children, \$350
