



36th Annual Shepherd's Center Used Book Sale May 4 - May 6, 2023

The Shepherd's Center of Greater Winston-Salem will hold its **36th Annual Used Book Sale** on **Thursday**, **May 4** & **Friday**, **May 5** from **9 am** to **9 pm**, and on **Saturday**, **May 6** from **8 am** to **2 pm**. On Saturday all items are ½ price. **Parking and Admission are FREE**! The sale will be held in the **Education Building** at the **Winston-Salem Fairgrounds**. Entrance for parking is through **Gate 5 from Deacon Blvd**. This is truly a **book sale with a purpose**!

Key Points Regarding the Disaffiliation Process from the United Methodist Church

- 1. There are currently churches in our denomination that will be seeking to disaffiliate in order to become independent churches or eventually join a new Methodist denomination known as the Global Methodist Church (GMC). These efforts have been facilitated by the Wesleyan Covenant Association (WCA), an organized group made up of the most conservative United Methodists who are against the full inclusion of LGBTQ persons in the church.
- 2. The main issue that has driven the new denomination and disaffiliation centers around human sexuality. Specifically questions of LGBTQ ordination and gay weddings in the church are the two points of contention regarding our Book of Discipline.
- 3. With General Conference the denomination's top lawmaking assembly postponed to 2024, plans for a formal denomination-wide separation over theological differences are up in the air. That leaves disaffiliation decisions up to each of the 53 U.S. annual conferences regional bodies consisting of multiple congregations. United Methodist annual conferences have a lot of leeway in administering church disaffiliations. Some conferences are looking to use their reserves to cut the exit costs. Some are adding more financial obligations. Even with these variations, the number of church exits is climbing.
- 4. Currently in the Western NC Annual Conference, a church that wishes to disaffiliate must agree to pay up to two years of apportionments and all unfunded clergy pension liability, as detailed in Paragraph 2553 of the 2016 Book of Discipline, as updated by the 2019 General Conference. The reason for this is the trust clause which specifies that the property of the church is held by the conference. For small churches, this amount would be tens of thousands of dollars and for mid-sized churches the cost would be in the hundreds of thousands.
- 5. For a church to disaffiliate, there is a process that involves the district's guidance. A super majority of members (a ²/₃ vote) would be needed to approve disaffiliation. Afterwards, the Annual Conference would vote to approve disaffiliation. Following disaffiliation, a church can remain independent, join the GMC, or another Methodist denomination (such as the Wesleyan Church, Free Methodist Church, etc.).
- 6. Currently the United Methodist Book of Discipline states that the practice of homosexuality is incompatible with Christian teaching, that practicing LGBTQ clergy cannot be ordained, and that same gender weddings cannot be performed in our churches or by our clergy. LGBTQ people are considered of "sacred worth" by our church discipline.
- 7. In some more progressive churches, there have been gay weddings performed. Conferences in the western, northeast, and mid-Atlantic parts of the US have been more lax in enforcing the Discipline regarding gay clergy and same gender weddings. The WCA and other conservatives cite the breakdown in following the Book of Discipline as reason to leave the denomination. Progressives view the issues surrounding full inclusion of LGBTQ persons as a human rights issue not unlike past reform efforts in the church with African Americans and women.
- 8. Contrary to rumor, churches do not have to vote to stay in the United Methodist Church. There have been false claims by some persons who suggest that the United Methodist Church is changing its doctrine. The continuing United Methodist Church will uphold the traditional beliefs as found in our Articles of Religion. This includes belief in the Trinity, the Resurrection, Virgin Birth, Divinity of Christ, Sufficiency of Scripture for Salvation, Original Sin, Free Will, and the Methodist understanding of Grace. We will continue to affirm the historic doctrine of the faith as shared via the Apostles' Creed.
