So Many Questions, and a Few Answers about the Potential Merger

I present you today with a basic paradox of Christian life: we know that good things will happen to us and for us, AND we don't know how or when those things will occur.

The following verses illustrate this contradiction:

"And we know that for those who love God all things work together for good, for those who are called according to his purpose." Romans 8:28 "If no one knows what will happen, who can tell him when it will happen?" Ecclesiastes 8:7

The congregations of Burkhead UMC and of Wesley Memorial UMC are faced with many questions about our potential merger. While there are details yet to be worked out, perhaps it would be helpful to share the following information.

To recap what is known currently:

- Wesley Memorial UMC is choosing Wesley Community Development as its real estate representative in the upcoming sale of its property. <u>https://wesleycdc.com/</u>
- Julie O'Neal and Ben Sloan have met with Yadkin Valley District Superintendent Rev. Dr. Sam Moore who is hopeful about the merger of the two congregations into one new congregation. Rev. Moore would prefer to serve as a cheerleader or coach for Ben and Julie, but not personally lead the discussions concerning the merger. Rev. Moore advocates complete transparency inasmuch as it is possible as we plan ahead (as opposed to the traditional UMC stance to hold all information private concerning pastoral changes and moves); that we begin to find ways of worshiping and sharing the Burkhead space together (we already are doing this); and that we remember that this will be an ongoing process, not a single date when everything changes.
- The recommendation of both pastors is that all of the paid personnel from both churches be retained. No individuals will be let go, except Julie who will be retiring and will not be appointed to Burkhead or any other congregation. It is expected that Rev. Ben Sloan will be the pastor of the newly formed joint congregation.
- We anticipate that SPARK will maintain its workspace here, and that other ministries and outreach opportunities will be housed in the facility.
- Rev. Sloan and his family already own a home in the area and do not intend to occupy the current Burkhead parsonage. Selling, renting, or otherwise utilizing the parsonage will be one of many details yet to be determined.
- In an effort to bring two United Methodist congregations into one worshiping body, it is likely that there will be a name change of some type, again, TBD.

We will continue to keep the congregation updated whenever additional information is available. Please contact me to ask for clarifications, to mention concerns, and to offer encouragement whenever possible. Julie Elliott O'Neal, 336-929-6001
